- Even after leaving refuge, where do they go then?
- THEY HAVE THE **EXACT SAME OPTIONS**...
 - 'Sofa surfing' the HIDDEN HOMELESS victims have been isolated/want to protect
 - Temporary Accommodation B&B, hotel **not safe options**!
 - Supported Accommodation a different offer to refuge not confidential (safe)
 - Private rent simply not affordable also subject to references and credit searches
 - Social Housing options are poor and single person availability is even worse!
 - Return home.... THIS ESCALATES THE VICTIMS RISK IMMEDIATELY!

The Reality?



The STARK reality:

- Women are forced to stay in abusive relationships, or return to
- Women are faced with the choice of making their children homeless or safe
- Homeowners cannot afford both temporary accommodation AND paying the mortgage, multiple bills
- Women in FTE cannot access refuge unless leave job
- Universal Credit provides the abuser with even more power and control over finances
- Benefit Caps and Pre-Tenancy Checks disproportionately affect women
- Local Housing Allowance (LHA) Rates in the private rented sector are completely out of step with market rents
- Shared Accommodation Rate (under age 35) exemptions are not applied effectively women forced to share mixed gender shared accommodation
- Why should victims have to leave their homes?
- Why should victims have to choose between staying in their own home (and fear for their life)
 or uproot everything and leave their home behind?
