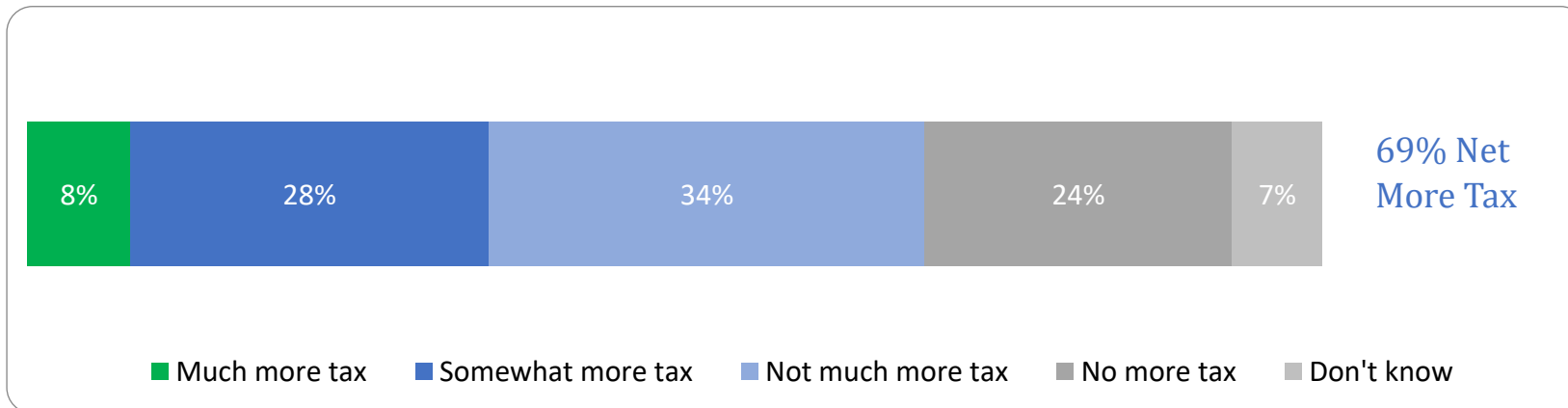


Public wants an economy that prioritises care and equality and they are willing to pay more tax for this

Below is a breakdown of the most significant results from the polling.

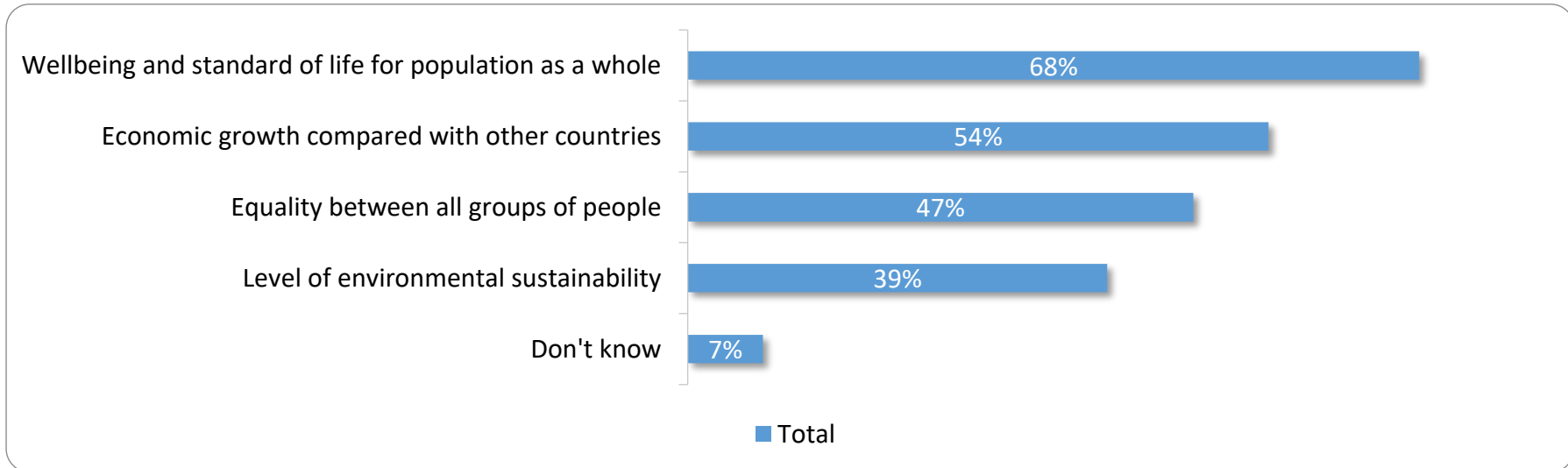
A significant majority (69%) of the population would be willing to pay more tax to support well paid and secure jobs for everyone.

Q. Would you be willing to pay more tax to support the following? Well-paid and secure jobs for everyone?



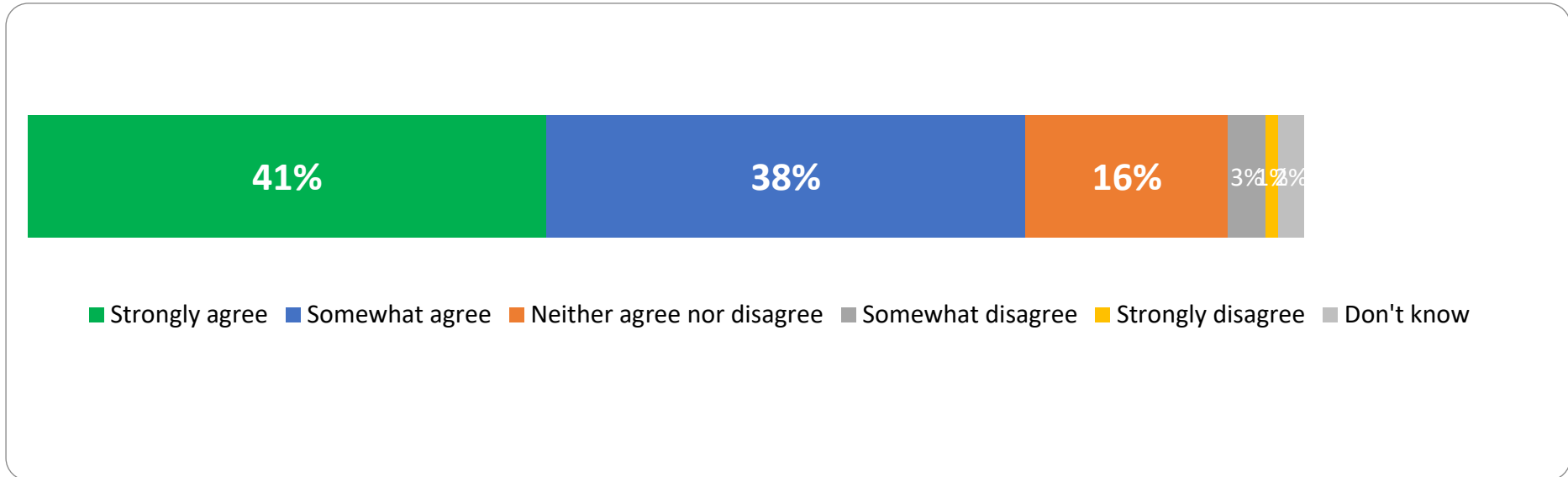
A large majority of the population believe that wellbeing and standard of life should be used to judge the success of Government economic policy. 80% of over 65 year olds agreed with this.

Q. Which of the following should be used to measure the success of Government economic policy? Please select all that apply.



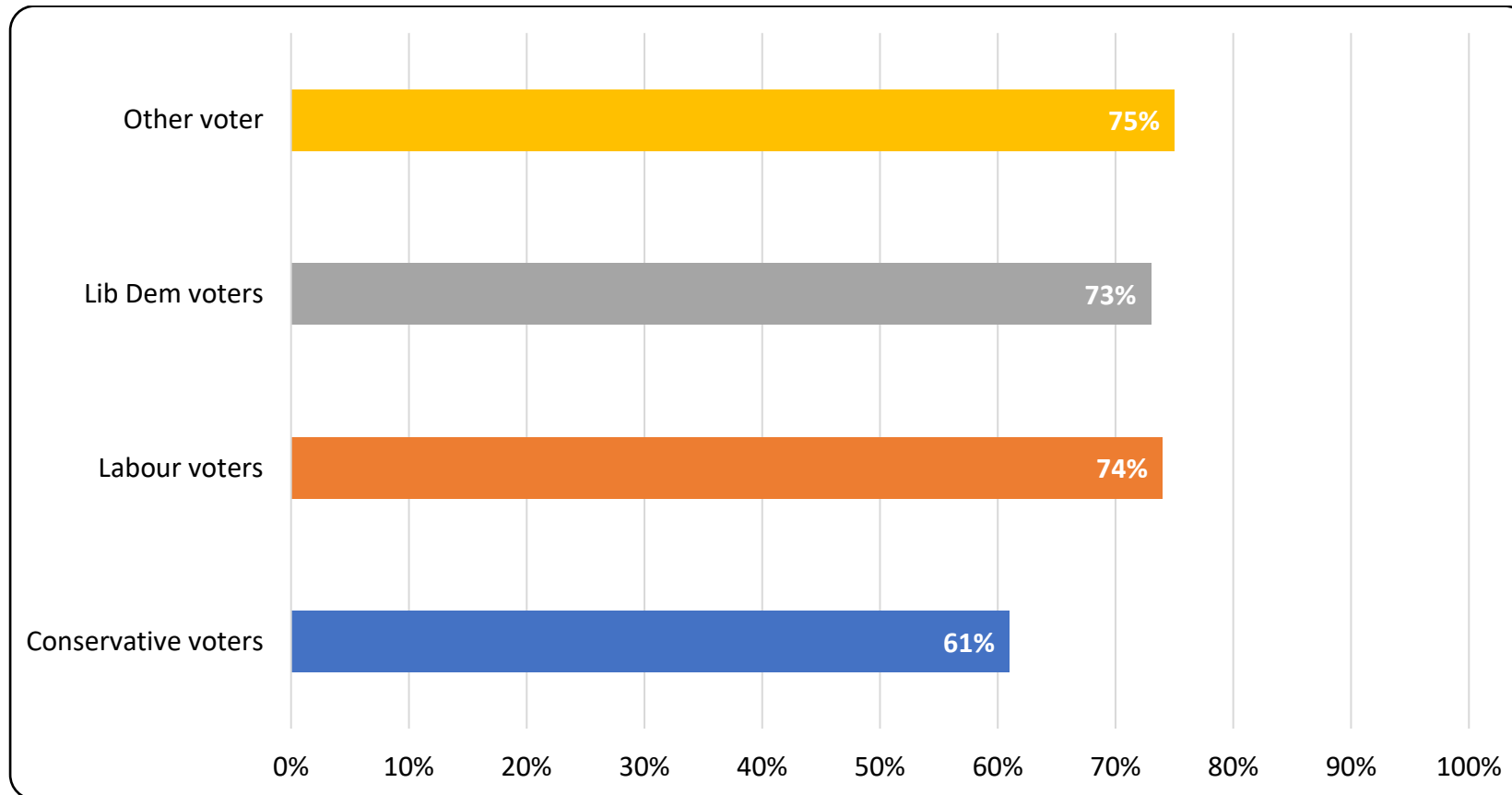
Four in five (79%) agree that women and men should share care tasks for children and/or older and disabled relative equally

Q. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? Women and men should share caring tasks for children and/or older or disabled relatives more equally



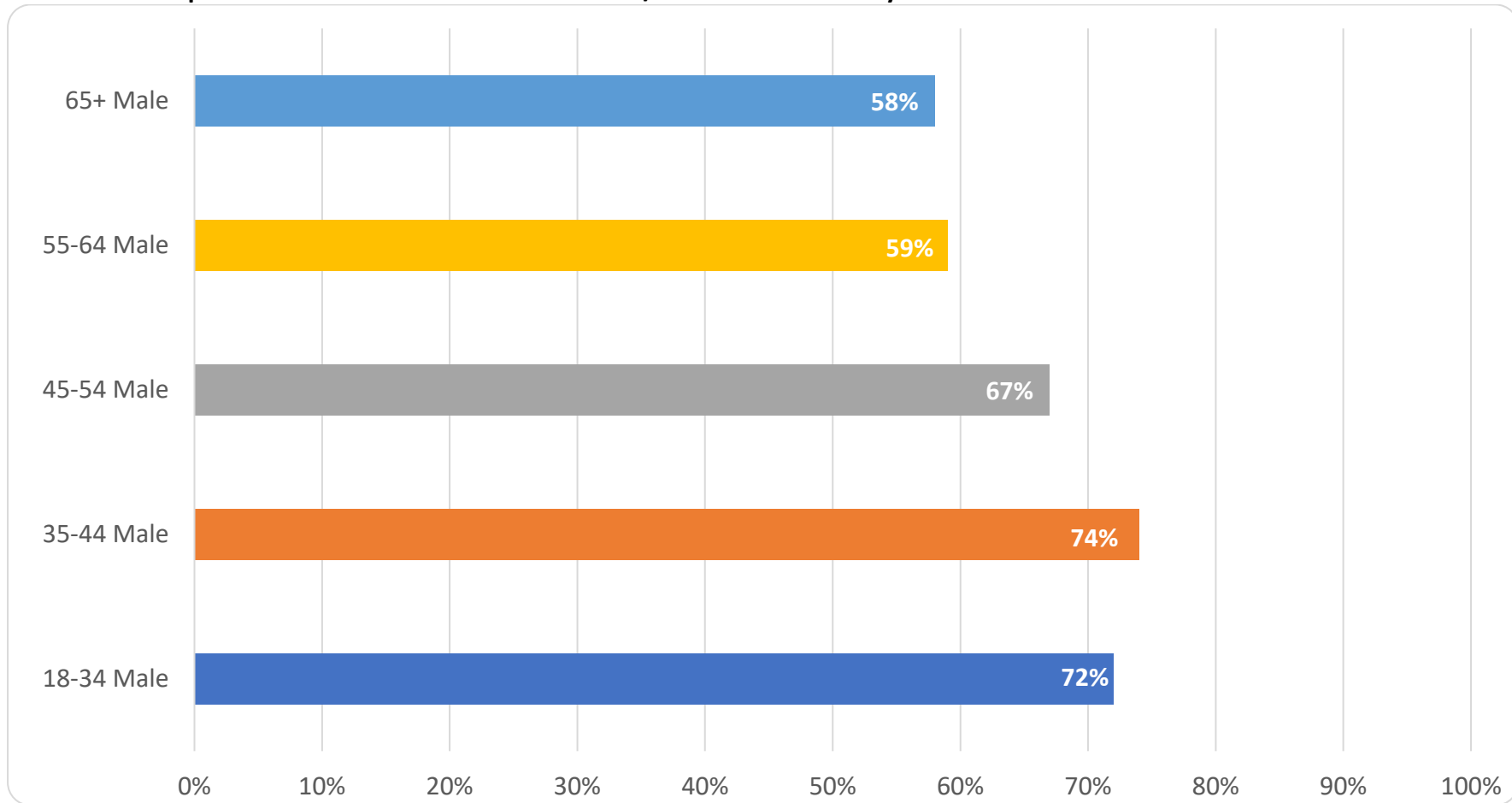
There is widespread support amongst the population for the Government to intervene in order to support men to do more unpaid care work, including among young men and across the political spectrum.

Q. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? Men should be encouraged and financially supported by the Government to provide more care for their children and/or disabled or elderly relatives



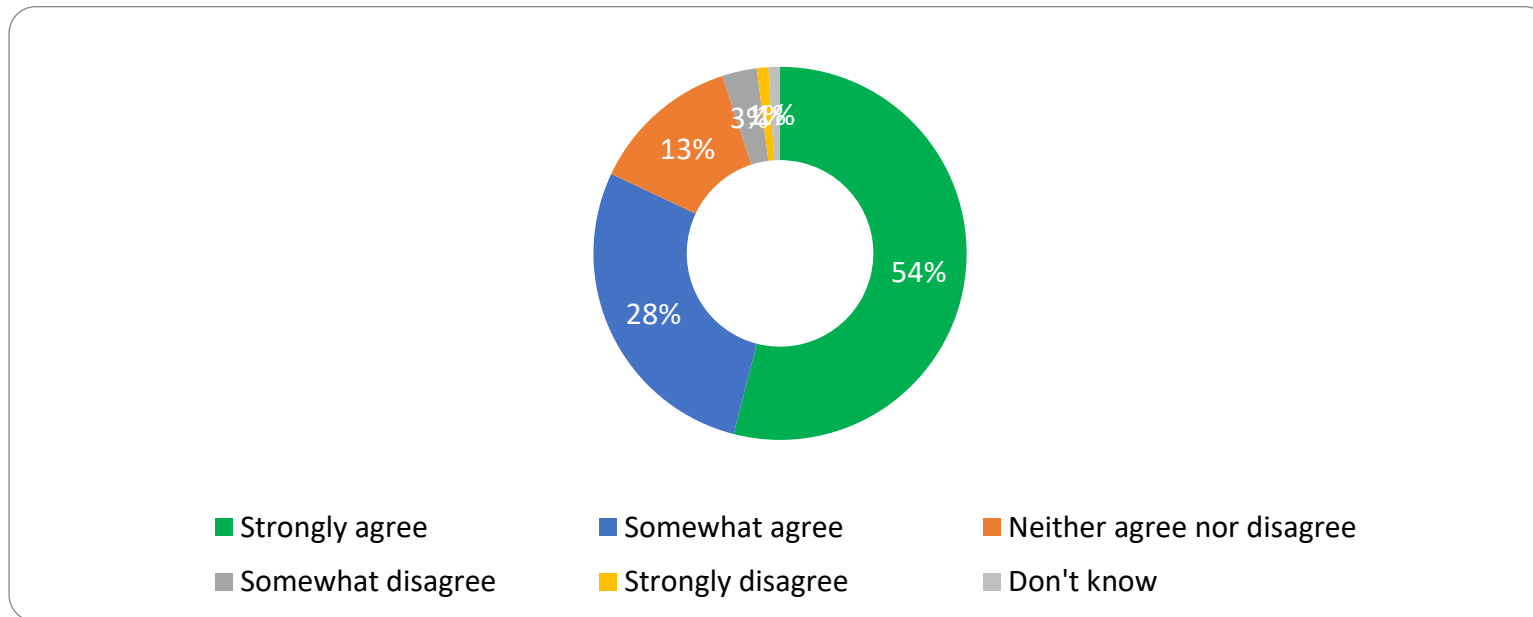
Younger men were more likely to support this proposal:

Q. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? Men should be encouraged and financially supported by the Government to provide more care for their children and/or disabled or elderly relatives



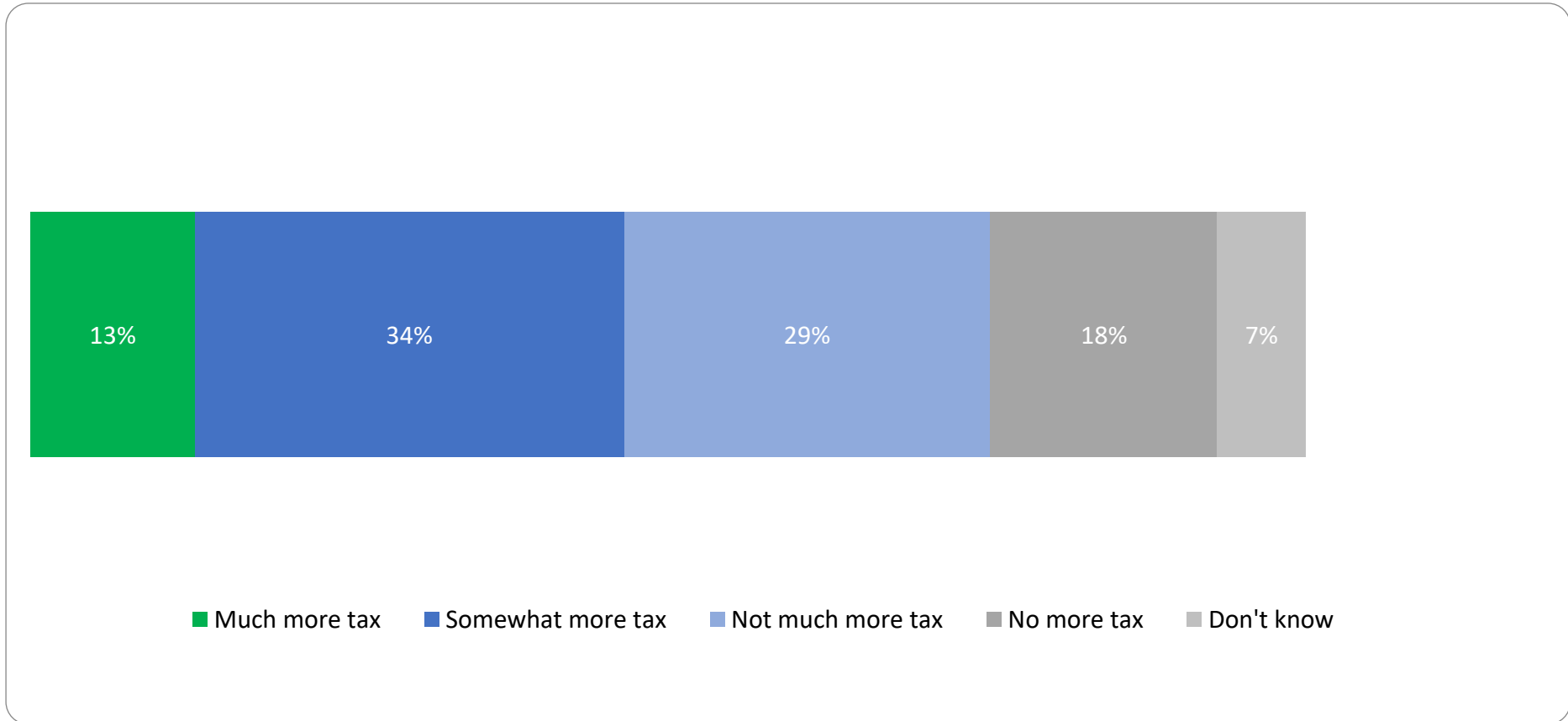

Q. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? Social care for older people and disabled people should be available to everyone based on their care needs, not their wealth



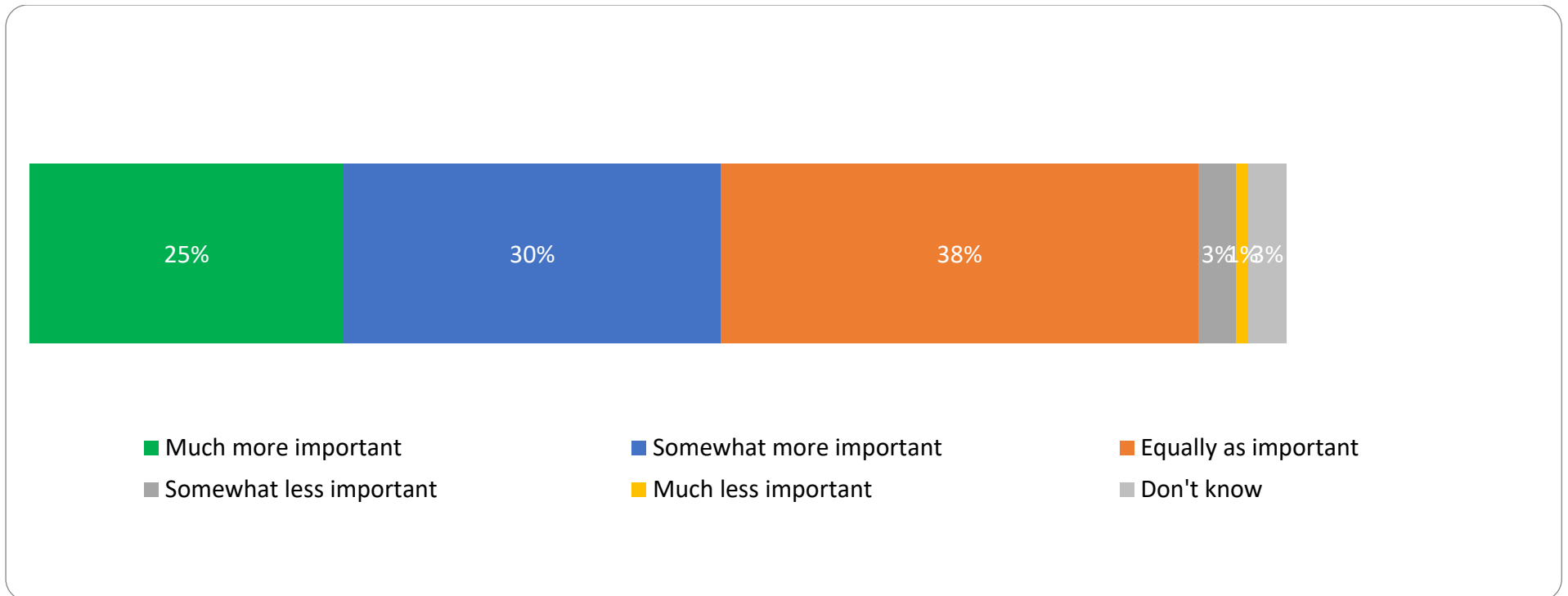
Free social care for all adults over 65 and disabled people is the policy that most unites the population.

Q. Would you be willing to pay more tax to support the following? Investment in free social care for all adults over the age of 65 and disabled people



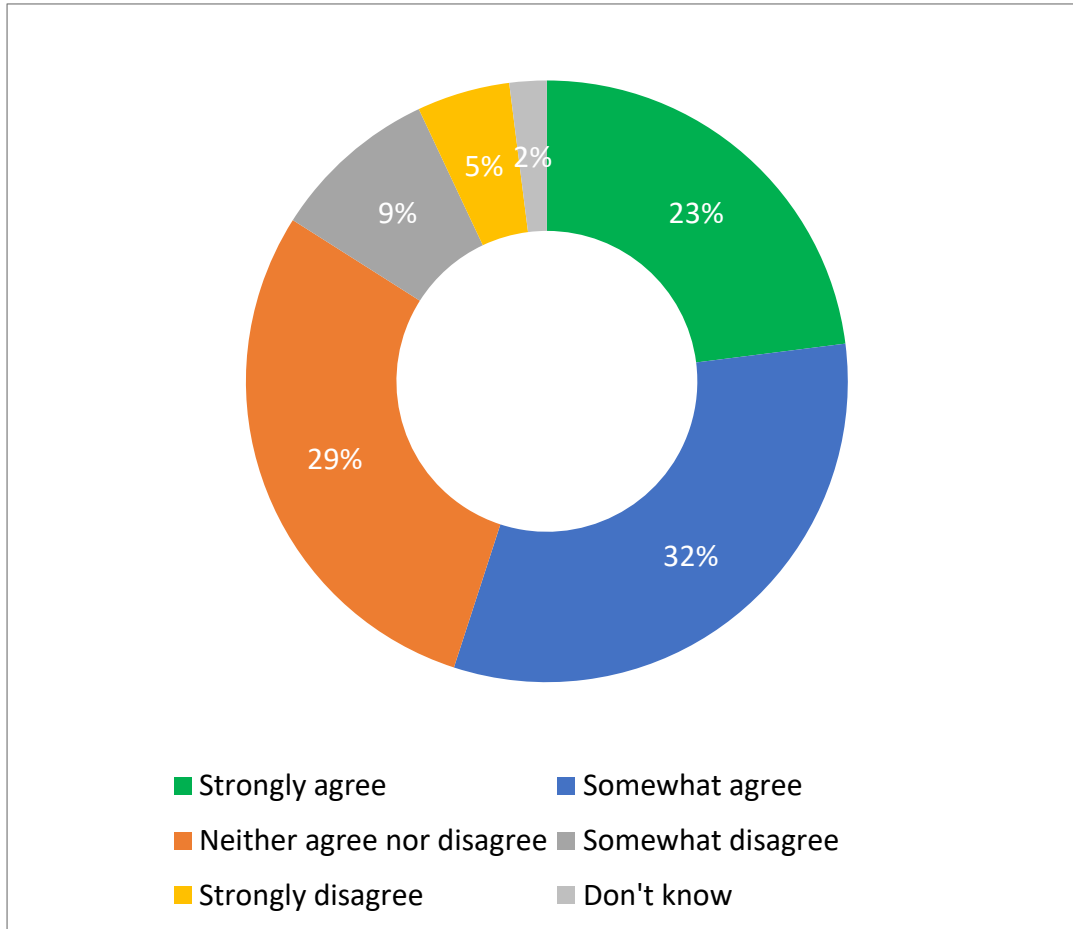
55% of the population believe investment in health, education and social care is more important to the economy than technology and transport infrastructure.

Q. Do you think Government investment in education, health and social care is: more important or less important to the future of the economy than Government investment in technology and transport infrastructure?



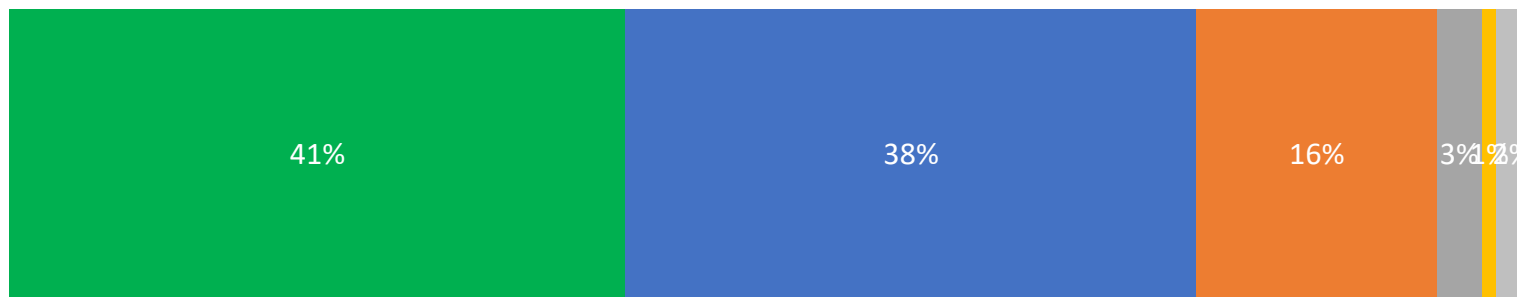
Three in four agree that economic equality between women and men is the mark of a good society.

Four in five agree that women and men should share care tasks for children and/or older and disabled relative equally

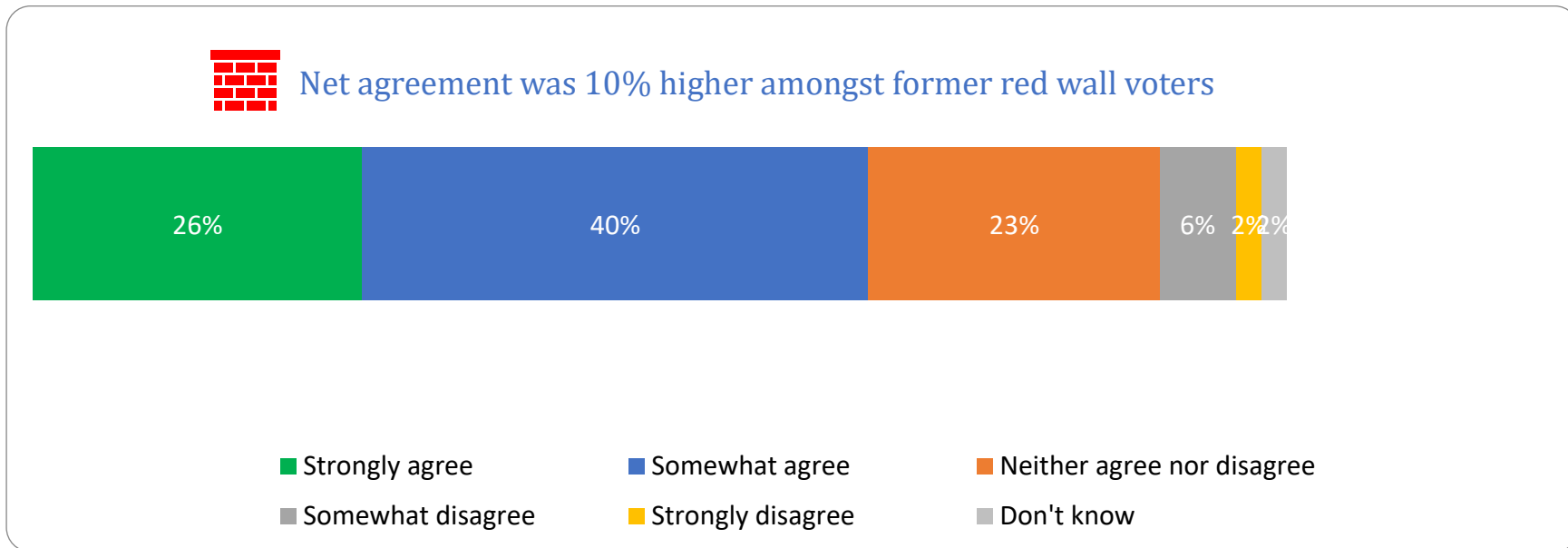
Q. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? Women and men should share caring tasks for children and/or older or disabled relatives more equally
